

New Organ Update

Some members of our congregation have asked a few questions about the possibility of obtaining a new organ for our church. We will try to answer those questions as clearly as we can at this early stage in the process.

Q: "Why do we need a new organ? The one we have sounds just fine."

A: The organ seems to have a mind of its own (if that was possible), in that some keys work at one time and then refuse to work at another time - not always the same key. Our organists are so adept at adjusting to the sudden changes that most of us do not recognize a problem. In fact, the organ has totally stopped during one practice session

Q: "Organists are hard to find these days. What happens in the future?"

A: Organists ARE hard to find, no doubt about it. It would be much more difficult to hire a new organist IF we have an organ that seems to be dying. We also have 2 dedicated people playing now and one of our members can step in if needed.

Q: "How much is a new organ going to cost?"

A: Good question! We are exploring various installations around our area and have discussed costs with two organ company representatives. We are dedicated to obtaining a sound working organ at a reasonable price. We recognize our building is not suitable for a pipe organ and also not suitable for some of the larger electronic organs. We don't have a \$\$ figure as yet - that will be determined by the final selection.

Q: "I'm interested in making a donation for a new organ. How do I do that?"

A: There is an Organ Fund account in place. If you wish to make a donation, be sure to make a note directing it to that fund. Further information on the Fund will be coming when we have made a selection of a new instrument.

We are open to further questions anyone might have. Feeding Lunches to Youth

The FLY Board met on Monday, February 3rd and it was decided the Spring Break sites will be Squaw Creek, Marion Village, and Valley View, with another possible site in the Marion Independent District being added.

FLY board members have been making HACAP deliveries to four Marion Independent schools every Friday with about 80 bags going home in just the MISD schools alone. HACAP sends bags of food home with area students on the free/reduced lunch program to make sure they have food over the weekends.

FLY will also be purchasing car flags and magnets with the FLY logo on them to better help children and families identify volunteers' vehicles when they deliver the sack lunches.

Applications for the FLY internships will open on February 5th with a closing date of March 1st.

FLY is in need of supplies and I have offered to do a collection of brown paper sack lunch bags at LCR. Please look for the tub in the Gathering Space to leave your donations of #4 size brown paper bags.





Stephen Ministry

Stephen Ministry Training Class in the Home Stretch!

The class of 8 Stephen Ministers at Lutheran Church of the Resurrection is nearing completion, with five class sessions left before the group is commissioned on *March 8th and 11th*.

"Our trainees have worked extremely hard and their dedication is paying off," says Mary Hajek. "The course has involved pre-class reading assignments and in-class lecture, discussion, and role playing. Our trainees are showing growth in knowledge and skills.'

A recurring emphasis of Stephen Ministry training has been confidentiality. What a care receiver says to his or her Stephen Minister is held strictly confidential. Even the identity of the care receiver is kept confidential from other Stephen Ministers - and everyone else.

The emphasis on confidentiality is important for potential care receivers. Most people are reluctant to share their problems and situations because they're afraid of others finding out. The confidentiality of Stephen Ministry lets people know they can discuss difficult concerns with their Stephen Minister and not be afraid of other people finding out.

After the class is commissioned and new Stephen Ministers receive their first care-giving assignment, their training will continue. Continuing education is an important component of Stephen Ministry. They will meet twice a month for continuing education and supervision. It is used to enhance their skills and learn new ways to care. We want to provide the best care possible to our care receivers.

This fund has three 'buckets:' <u>maintenance</u> (building upkeep and repair); <u>ministry</u> (Director of Communications position); and <u>mission</u> (Camp Chisomo, Marion Cares, Habitat for Humanity).

Total given to Camp Chisomo for the year is \$5,250. At the end of October, we have given Habitat for Humanity \$15,000 of a \$15,000 commitment. We have also given Marion Cares \$10,000 of a \$10,000 commitment for the year. Our building maintenance costs for the year through December have been \$33,298 and marketing costs \$45,346


