

BE OPEN!

"Then looking up to heaven, he sighed and said to him, "Ephphatha," that is, "Be opened." - *Mark 7.34*

As a kid I remember loving the old movies that centered around genies and the mysterious east! "The Thief of Baghdad," "The Flying Carpet," or the "The 7 Voyages of Sinbad" all would equally entertain. And what about "Arabian Nights," where the secret phrase would allow you entry into a magical reality - - Open Sesame!

Open Sesame! To be opened was to reveal the secrets that lay within. To be opened was to allow the story to continue in a new and marvelous way. To be opened was the first step in a new relationship that was about to unfold. In the Gospel of Mark, there is a man who cannot hear or speak and his friends ask for him to be healed and we are told that Jesus looking up to heaven, sighed and said to him, "Ephphatha," that is, "Be opened." And immediately his ears were opened, his tongue was released, and he spoke plainly. (Mark 7.33-35)

The season of Lent which begins on Ash Wednesday (February 17) is a time for us to be opened. It is not always by intention but we can often find ourselves feeling closed off to God and the spiritual realities of our life. We become so busy and overwhelmed - especially this year - that we find ourselves stuck and shut off.

Let's use our Lenten time to be opened to the workings of the Holy Spirit. Open Our Eyes, Lord! Paul saw the light of Christ shining around him on the road to Damascus. As individuals and communities, what do we have difficulty seeing? How does our perspective change when we view the world through the eyes of Christ? Consider praying for God to help you 'see' as God sees the world!

Open Our Hands, Lord! We use our hands to pick up a child, to serve a meal, to play an instrument, to wipe away a tear. Jesus used his hands for healing and for deeds of great power, and the psalmist reminds us that we are always held fast in God's hands. How might we open our hands to serve God and neighbor?

Open Our Hearts, Lord! How might we begin to have hearts that are filled with compassion and caring for others; not just turned in on our own selfish desires? Kindness and hospitality can open us up to the realities of God.

Open Sesame! Ephphatha! May it be so with us! Peace! Pastor Jeff

Bethany Mast (2nd Monday @ 8:00 pm)



Building Policy Update

We are blessed at LCR with facilities that allow us to gather safely and practice social distancing! We gather in-person on Wednesday evenings at 7:00 pm, alternating each week between the 7th grade and 8th grade classes. We also have on-line Confirmation videos available, and they are posted on the LCR web page.

Our focus for the year is on the scriptures and each of the Confirmands will know the answers to these and many other questions. I invite you to see if you know as much as a Confirmation student! Are you ready??

- * How many books are in the Old Testament? Can you name them?
- * How many books are in the New Testament? Can you name them?
- * The Hebrew Bible or Old Testament is often divided into three main categories. Can you name them? Can you explain what you will find in each of the categories?
- * What are the first 5 books of the Old Testament? What do we call those first five books?
- * Where do you find the Ten Commandments in the Bible?
- * Where do you find the story of Jesus in the scriptures?
- * Who is the Apostle Paul, and what books did Paul write?
- * Where do you find the story of the birth of the church in the Bible?
- * How does the Bible present the story of salvation from the Genesis to Revelation?
- * What is the Law? What is the Gospel?

Together we are discussing these, and many other questions, as we study scripture together. However, Confirmation is about so much more than answering questions about scripture. Our hope is to help the kids understand how the scriptures impact their daily lives through in-person service projects and opportunities for faith reflection.

Teaching Confirmation is one of the greatest honors I have ever been granted and I am humbled and grateful that you have allowed me to share in the faith journey of these future leaders of LCR.
