

Who are we at LCR?

"By this everyone will know that you are **my disciples**, if you have love for one another." *John 13.35*

As a part of our Lenten observance I have invited folks to join with me in reading the Gospel of Luke and Acts of the Apostles as a spiritual discipline. I love scripture! And I'm always amazed how the Holy Spirit opens new insights even from passages that I have studied over and over again. This year it was Luke's sense of mission that struck me. In Luke 8 we find the women (Mary Magdalene, Joanna, Susanna "and many others") who are providing for Jesus ministry and travel with him. Then in Luke 9 we get the specific sending out of the twelve disciples for the sake of God's mission through Jesus. When we get to Luke 10 we have the 70 that are sent out in pairs to proclaim the Reign of God! There is movement here in Luke's Gospel that is centered on sending, participating and being a part of what Jesus is doing in the world. For Luke you can't separate one's faith from one's actions.

How do we at LCR participate in this unfolding call to participate in what Jesus is doing? In other words, what is our identity - or perhaps more pointedly, do we remember who we are? I've asked out staff to think about what it means to be a neighborhood church - that is people who are sent out to be about the work of Jesus. I've asked our church council to ponder a bit about the 'identity' of LCR - do we know who we are, what God has called us to be about and how we live out that purpose.

If we are to be a vital and sustainable congregation we need to remember that we have been called to share the Good News of the reign of God. In other words, we need to be reminded that ministry is not about me, about getting my way, about protecting my turf, or about holding on to some "golden age." It is about being sent into the world. It is about bringing people together in order to send them out as followers of Jesus. Ministry is about putting faith into action for the sake of the neighbor.

Do you believe that Jesus called those women to be a part of what he was doing? Do you believe that Jesus called the twelve disciples to go out and proclaim the Kingdom of God. Do you believe that Jesus sent the 70 to go ahead of him into the towns and villages? Do you believe that Jesus has called us here at LCR to share in this same Good News? I do!

Gathered in love, we are sent to serve. This simple message is still at the core of who we are.

HOLY WEEK

The week before Easter is called Holy Week. Our Lenten preparations and repentance deepen as we focus on the events of Jesus' life from his entrance into Jerusalem until his death on the cross and burial in the garden tomb. Palm/Passion Sunday commemorates the triumphal entry into Jerusalem and the story of the crucifixion is also read on this day. On Maundy Thursday the church gives thanks to Jesus for the giving of the Lord's supper - Holy Communion. Maundy Thursday ends with the 'stripping of the altar' which reminds us of Jesus' arrest in the Garden of Gethsemane. Good Friday is the most solemn of all days in the Christian church, we pause to remember his suffering and death - which is good in as it is the means of our salvation. Easter Sunday, the day of Resurrection is the beginning of 50 days of feasting and joy as we remember Christ's victory over death.
