

"The righteous flourish like the palm tree, and grow like a cedar in Lebanon." Psalm 92.12

Here's a confession: for the past 18 years I had gardeners who took care of my lawn - mowed it, fertilized it, weeded it, edged it and generally made it look great. Alas, my Home Owner Association gardeners didn't come with me to Iowa, so I've had to re-learn the joys and frustrations of caring for a lawn!

Part of this, of course, is a trip to Menard's or Lowes, or wherever you prefer, and buying just the right fertilizer to help Mother Nature do her best. When I lived in Washington State I first learned about the secret numbers on fertilizer bags. You see, almost every bag of fertilizer will have three (3) numbers printed on the bag. It might be 32-5-5 or 5-10-20 or, my personal favorite, the general work horse of homeowners, 12-12-12! At first I just bought whatever bag was stacked in front of the aisle cap, but eventually I became a connoisseur of fertilizer.

The best way to understand the numbers was this little rhyme: Up, Down, All Around. The first number determined how much straight up growth you'd get. This high-in-nitrogen fertilizer would send your grass to the moon and mean lots of additional mowing. The second number determined how much energy would go into the roots, helping the grass establish itself. The third number would dictate to what extent the grass would reach out and fill in holes and gaps in the yard.

Ok, so what on earth does this have to do with us in the church? Well, besides some rather helpful information about fertilizer, I think this begs the question of what kind of 'spiritual fertilizer' might I be in need of right now! And more importantly, what kind of spiritual fertilizer would you throw on our church if you had the chance? Do we need to stand up a bit taller in the saddle and boldly proclaim our faith and gifts? That kind of growth is always exciting - but just like adding 36-0-0 to your lawn, it also creates a lot of work! Or, perhaps we need to work on our roots. Not worrying so much about keeping up with the current trends and desires, but spend time in the basics - taking the time for such timeless disciplines as prayer, scripture, worship and good works. This kind of growth is key to long-term health but it also takes concerted effort and desire. Then again, maybe what we really need to be doing is spreading ourselves out, growing our fellowship and taking up more chairs and spots in the parking lot. After all, our mission is to proclaim the Gospel to the world and there are still folks who need to hear it. This kind of growth is exciting as well, but it does come with a cost as we have to give up some of our control and allow others to shape us.

Do me and God a favor; work on at least one of these. Stretch yourself in new ways of living your faith, or take the time to work on your roots, or be intentional about inviting others to join us and then helping them connect. You see, it's spring and living things need to grow. We need to grow: Up, Down and All Around - and so does our church! Let me know what kind of fertilizer you'd put on our congregation right now. I tend to err toward the balanced 12-12-12; but maybe you see something that needs a little extra boost - tell me about it! *Peace - Pastor Jeff*


# Neighborhood Nights

The Council met on Tuesday, April 20th. Secretary's & Treasurer's reports were approved. The General Fund balance was \$112,541 at the end of March.

<u>Pastor Jeff</u>: Organist position is now being posted; may have to employ a temporary pianist 'til job is filled. Wednesday worship now has a separate sermon each week, frequently given by Pr. Nate.

<u>*Pastor Nate*</u>: Some money will need to be added to Outreach budget for summer events.

*Governance*: Connected with insurance company and wrote a policy regarding liability. Building Use Request Form has been updated to include Covid restrictions. Need to define vision and roles & responsibilities.

<u>*Treasurer*</u>: Ran deficit in March but bank accounts are all good. Will need to keep a close eye on budget to anticipate future changes.

<u>Stewardship</u>: Planned facility upgrade jobs will be completed by end of April and expenses paid. Stewardship Charter presented to Council and approved. Spring classes were discussed.

<u>Outreach</u>: First bingo event went well, will be advertised on Facebook in May. Visitor give-away bags are coming together. Continued need for tech booth volunteers.

<u>Property</u>: Gathering space walls are painted and garage door replaced. Need to address leaky windows and mold in garage workshop. Pondering patio fence replacement. New benches will be built as an Eagle Scout project.

<u>Old/New Business</u>: Council members will attend Synod Assembly with pastors.

<u>Next Meeting</u>: Tuesday, May 18th, 2021 Agenda items should be submitted by 5/10. Copies of Council minutes and Treasurer's reports are available in the church office binder.
