

"Let there be light..." Genesis 1.3

The Christmas season has ended, and, like children who have opened all of their presents, we are not sure what to do next. Is the excitement over? Do we go back to what we had been doing a few weeks ago? What difference has it all made? Where are the crowds who joined us on Christmas Eve? Where do we go next? Such are the questions that follow such a wondrous time as Christmas.

Although the seasons of Advent and Christmas are a hard act to follow we here at Lutheran Church of the Resurrection have much to be excited about! On January 6 we will enter the church season of Epiphany. An epiphany is a sudden realization or an intuitive leap. It is the time in the church year that we begin to share the story of just who this Christ child really is. The main symbol of Epiphany is Light: Both the light of the star which the Wise men followed; but also the light of God that has come into the world through the person of Jesus.

This year - 2022 - gives us an opportunity to move forward in confidence with the work that God has given us to accomplish here at LCR. I am hopeful that soon we'll have our pastoral staff at full strength and that this, coupled with your excitement and support, will help set the foundation for years of healthy and faithful ministry. With all the possibilities before us, we need to remember what Jesus said about light; we don't hide it unto ourselves but need to put it out for all to see. How will we be known in our community? How will the light of this baby born in Bethlehem shine in and through us? How will our life together proclaim to the world the light of Christ?

That is my Epiphany prayer for all of us here at LCR - may we let the light of Christ shine through all that we do! And here's a place for us to start, ask this simple question: What is the one thing I can do, today, that will point others to Christ? A light not only can keep us on the path; but it can also draw others to us and our ministry. Let there be light in all we do...keeping us faithful to the task at hand; and inviting others to walk beside us.

Congregational Annual Meeting set for January 30th at 11:45 am

All voting members of Lutheran Church of the Resurrection are encouraged to join us for our Annual Meeting on Sunday January 30 at 11:45 AM in the Sanctuary. The official announcement and agenda will be sent to all members at least 10 days prior to the meeting. We will elect officers, approve the budget and vote on the recommendation to extend a letter of call for a full-time Associate Pastor. As has been our practice there will be a "Budget Forum" the previous Sunday (January 23 time TBA) for anyone who would like more information prior to the Annual Meeting.

Recommendation to Extend a Letter of Call for Pastor Nate Montover

Last September the congregation was asked by the council if the congregation would be interested in having a conversation about extending a letter of Call to Pastor Nate Montover to serve as our full-time Associate Pastor. Currently, Pastor Nate is a contract pastor who is at LCR two days a week and one Sunday a month. The congregation has responded with overwhelming support to consider this opportunity. After having several invitations to hear from the congregation, the council as acting Call Committee has discerned the desire of the congregation to present the name of



Pastor Nate Montover at our Annual Meeting for a vote to extend to him a Letter of Call to serve as our full time Associate Pastor. We ask all our voting members to be present on January 30th, and to prayerfully reflect on the mutual responsibility of calling an Associate Pastor to work with us at LCR.

On the night of December 10th, a devastating outbreak of more than 30 tornadoes swept through six states. Kentucky was impacted the most, with more than 70 people reported dead. Homes and businesses were destroyed. Lutheran Disaster Response is engaging with partners in the affected areas, including the Indiana-Kentucky Synod, to respond to immediate needs. Given the initial damage assessments, recovery will likely take years, and Lutheran Disaster Response is prepared to accompany



The Council met on Tuesday, December 21, 2021. November Secretary's and Treasurer's reports were approved. The December Treasurer's Report will be available after all December expenses have been recorded.

Pastor Jeff: Christmas service plans underway. Contemporary Worship Leader position still open.

Treasurer: YTD income exceeded expenses by \$43K.

Stewardship: Annual Appeal response was 54%. Prepared draft 2022 budget.
