Holy, Holey, Wholly!

No, my spell checker hasn't gone wrong, but I have been thinking about holiness, which means being set aside for God or being connected to the sacred. And of course, we have a couple of homophones for holy: wholly - complete; and holey - leaky or porous. It seems to me that all of these words have something in common, but where did this all begin?

First a question: "What makes the Bible holy?" After all, the Bible in many ways is simply a book, actually a collection of 66 different books, written in different times by different folks. It contains songs, poetry, editorials, history, genealogies, law codes, parables, letters and admonitions. So, what makes it holy? It is not the words on the page that make the Bible holy; it is the function of those words that make the Bible holy. The Bible, in a unique way, brings us to Christ, brings us to God, and that is what makes it holy. After all, we worship the Living Word - Jesus; not the written word - scripture; however it is scripture that uniquely and reliably helps us to encounter Jesus Christ, and thereby, as a condition of its function, the Bible is holy. Still with me?

So, can other things beside the Bible be holy? Yes, of course, those things that bring us to Christ are indeed holy. Scripture remains the source and norm of our life together; nevertheless, there are other things that are at work as well.

I have room for the fact that often God uses rather holey (remember permeable, leaky) things and people, to lead us to Godself and thus make us whole (complete). I can personally attest that I have been led further into my relationship with Christ while talking with strangers, watching a movie, listening to music, hiking in the outdoors, having medical procedures, digging in the yard, playing with the dog, and, yes, even while being at church. To limit the work of the Holy Spirit to any one particular place - even a holy place like church or within the confines of scripture - is to limit the power and reach of Jesus Christ.

This is, in turn, one of the great lessons of the Reformation (we celebrate Reformation Day on Sunday, October 29th). It is a corollary of the understanding that all of us are called and set aside to serve God in the world (the fancy name for this is the 'priesthood of all believers). In other words, we should expect to find Christ hiding in plain sight! For Jesus to be present in our everyday world and interactions. And not only that, but that we should enter into each day with the full expectation that Jesus can and will use us to be holy! Yes, even holey folks like us can be made whole and help reflect and lead others to a holy God. So my friends, in this Reformation month may we sing loudly and proudly: Holy, Holey, Wholly. And in so doing proclaim one of the great mysteries of God!


